Keep your restaurant

...and outdoors

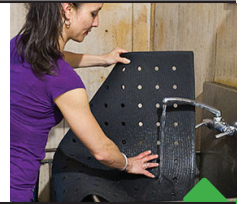


Train your employees about
these clean water practices:

Only rain down outdoor storm drains.
NO grease, NO dirt, NO garbage,
and **NO wash water.**

Floor Mats

- Wash floor mats in a utility sink or near a floor drain
- Ensure that no wash water is discharged to parking lot or street storm drains, or ditches



Grease

- Pour grease into covered containers
- Once full, secure lid and discard in garbage
- Increase pickup frequency if needed to prevent containers from overflowing
- Clean off top/grate of any food waste accumulating on top
- Clean hood filters, ducts, and fans regularly



Mop Water

- Pour mop water into indoor sink, never outside



Dumpsters

- Shut the lid (less smell, fewer pests, and no rain inside)
- Keep dumpster and storage areas clean and swept
- Contact your service provider to repair or replace leaky dumpsters



What is stormwater?

Rainwater or snow that can pick up pollution and carry it to local waterways from parking lots and roadways through storm drains or ditches.

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN
